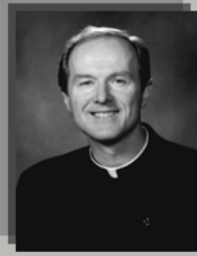

■ ■ FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Parishioners :

PARISH BUDGET AND WEEKLY

REPORTING: I need to explain some things about our parish budget. You have seen three different categories listed in the bulletin each week: "Needed" and "Actual" and "Difference". After discussing how we report our financial contributions with the Finance Council on Thursday, April 27, we will begin reporting our weekly contributions only in the following categories: "Tithing Budgeted" and "Tithing Received".

Each week in the bulletin, we have been reporting what is needed on a weekly average from 6 different categories: 1. Weekly Envelopes, 2. Loose Change, 3. Gifts/Donations/Memorials (from outside the parish), 4. Drexel Fund, 5. Interest Chancery, and 6. Use of Parish Property. The figure you see weekly listed as "Needed" is based upon taking all of these budget items and dividing them by 52 weeks. The figure of \$9,730 is approximately what is needed in receipts to meet our budgeted disbursements. The parish is directly responsible for the first two categories, weekly envelopes and loose change, provided in the Sunday offerings. For the other four categories, we are dependent upon outside sources, and we have no control over the timing of when these sources are received, during the course of the fiscal year. For example, we budgeted \$47,000 for the Drexel Fund, and to date we have received only

\$21,000. Because the Drexel Funds have been late in coming, this shortfall is reflected in the bulletin each week.

Beginning immediately, you will see listed "Tithing Budgeted" and "Tithing Received". We have budgeted a need of \$390,000 for envelopes and loose change in our fiscal year budget. This figure divided by 52 weeks is \$7,500. This is the figure you will begin to see reported in the bulletin. This figure will be lower than what has been reported previously as needed because it will only include two categories (weekly tithing and loose change) rather than the six categories.

I know this may be confusing, but if you have any questions please feel free to call me for a further explanation. As you can see from this week's bulletin, we are not far from what we have budgeted with our weekly envelopes and loose change
