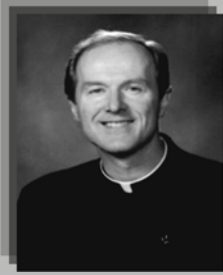

■ FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Parishioners:

Tithing Totals on Sundays

Each Sunday, the parish needs \$7,500 in order to meet our financial obligations of running a parish and school. This figure is noted in the bulletin, and we report the previous Sunday's totals. The tithing totals we report are taken from tithes in envelopes, electronic transfers, loose bills and change, and from loose checks from visitors. I noticed a mistake in our reporting, this past week.

We have, therefore, corrected the totals, and we are approximately \$3,000 ahead for this current fiscal year, which began July 1. While this is always good news, we have an additional challenge to meet. We are trying to absorb the cost of renovating the St. Peter Claver campus for our parish ministry. It cost \$47,000 to prepare the building for the celebration of Holy Mass and parish administration. This will require approximately \$1,000 each week in the collection. We really need \$8,500 to meet this new obligation. I ask that you truly give sacrificially and faithfully. I trust that God, our provident Father, will take care of the rest. We have been incredibly blessed!

Change in the Sunday Mass Schedule

Because of the increased number of Sunday evening Masses throughout the city, we have seen much smaller attendance at the 5:00 PM Mass. It seems no longer to serve the purpose it once did, and we also have lighting issues once the time change goes into effect. Therefore, after discussing this situation with the Parish Pastoral Council, we have decided to move the time of the Sunday evening Mass to 4:00 PM. Bishop Kemme also favors this change and suggested we keep the 4:00 PM time when we move into our new Church. Our first Sunday evening Mass at 4:00 PM will be Sunday, November 4, 2018.

"FULLY ALIVE AS MISSIONARY DISCIPLES"

"How hard it is for people who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God." In today's Gospel, we see the rich young man walk away with his head hanging low and for many of us, we understand (dare I say, recognize?) his sadness. Many of us, like the rich young man, live a life of faithful commitment to the commandments. We are prayerful and we follow the Golden Rule. However, if we were asked to leave our families and our possessions and dedicate our lives to our discipleship, many of us would respond with the same sadness. Our "things" matter to us way too much. Jesus doesn't want us to live in squalor, but he does want us to recognize when our relationship with God is broken by our unintentional idolatry. Being fully alive does not require a lot in terms of material goods. (See Matthew 6: 31-34) Perhaps it is time for you and I to start simplifying our lives. Do we have extra shoes, clothing, or coats that can be donated to those in need? Do we have extra dollars we can share with a neighbor who is running short? Can we take some free time this fall to help a friend rake leaves? Isn't it possible that giving away even some of our possessions would allow God to create conversion in our hearts?
